The 1985 North American Sprints and ARRL DX Contests are now history. Coming up are the CQ WPX contests and Field Day.

Field Day?! That's not a contest for real contesters! Or is it? We hope that the 1985 version IS! Plans are being drawn up for a challenge to the Northern California Contest Club, and hopefully, by the time you read this, the challenge will be in their hands and perhaps their reply on the way.

For perhaps the first time, our challenge to them is fair and will not hamper their efforts of winning other things. They will need a pretty flimsey excuse to get out of this one.

The only criteria is that they send their best seven transmitter effort out. All other details are up to them. The winner will receive a case of champagne from the loser!

Our plans are to use 10 watts, battery power, and lots of beams! Much of the equipment is lined up already but more is needed. The preferred transceiver is the Drake TR7 and several have been volunteered but anything that will operate on 12 VDC and withstand QRM is needed. Antennas, keyers, cables, and other accessories are necessary, too. And if you want to operate, we want you!

Tentative location is in the Santa Monica mountains. No definitive organizer has been chosen--this is a group effort--but if you can help, contact NE6I, N6TJ, or N6VI!

At a recent meeting of the SCCC it was decided that we would thallence the Morthern California Contest Club to a competition in the 1985 ARRL Field Day this coming June 22 -23. The datedory is 7-A. which means we will run up to seven transmitters at a time and will utilize as many operators and helpers as we can muster. Dur size will most likely be in the Santa Monica Mountains, where we have enjoyed success in past Field Days. In the spirit of Field Day. We will run our stations independent of commercial cower mains and will set up during the contest period. This will require coordination and lots of mancower as well as equipment and operating skill. In other words, WE NEED YOU !!!

In order to begin our planning now. it is important that we know who will join in and what resources we have available. We will have a particular need for operating positions (campers, etc.). antennas, tower sections and masts, coax and more coax. Emphasis will be on rios that can use 12vdc to minimize load on the denerators. Most antennas will be fixed at 70 decrees and won't need rotors. Because we will usually have both phone and cw stations doing on each active band. multiple antennas and good filtering will be important. The set-up effort will considerable. so even if you can be there for only a few hours you can really help. Please take a few minutes to complete the form and return it to:

I hope everyone had a productive January and Feburary if not on the low bands at least somewhere. We have been upgrading our primary contest station for our annual maximum contest effort, WPX! North counties has a serious lack of contest operators, but for the limited number of us, we try for two to three serious multi-op efforts per year. When we try to participate in more than two or three we never can put enough people together to be competitive. For the past couple of years we have settled in with the WPX contests because it is the most fun and comes the closest to DX-peditioning. The reason for this is with an un-usual call sign you can run good rate for almost 48 hours. Of course if we had our choice we would be at V3 or in the CARIBE but lacking funds and family co-operation the next best thing is WPX with a weird PREFIX. It is loads of fun and we flat get after it!! We have a Santa Maria Style BBQ on Saturday night and have a great time. No we don't shut the station down during the BBQ we relieve each operator so he can grub down.

We are seeking help this year because we feel that we have now reached the sites maximum potential as far as antennas and equipment but are still in need of operators to assist us in reaching its maximum potential HPS (Highest Possible Score). Our site has been upgraded tremondously since last years Calif. FIRST PLACE finish and USA FIFTH. Most recently Ray N6VR drove to Nevada and picked-up the newly installed 4 element 40 mtr beam. The 80 mtr phased verticles have been lengthened to 3/8 wave, 97 ft. and Ray has been fine tuning the station for WPX.

Ojai, is nested in the coastal mountains 2 hours drive from Orange County and 10 miles east of Ventura. Ojai means PEACEFUL VALLEY and Ray's site has a full 360 degree view of the valley as the site sits on top of a hill that rises 500+ feet above the valley floor. The location is quite unique. Come join us in the clean air with trout and bass fishing only 5 minutes away and together we will maximize the site, equipment and our contesting skills in preparation for the great FIELD DAY CHALLENGE!!!!!


