On that subject, last February's CW SPRINT once again found SCCC#1 blowing away the competition with an impressive 132K score. That's an average of 13.2K per op. WOW. SCCC#2 (minus 4 ops) came in 8th in the competition, beating the likes of the once great Murphy's Mauraders, and other noteworthy teams such as "Dead Lizards Can't Send CW," "Inorganic Nines and Zeros," and "Corn, Cows, and a Big Black Hole." And the rest of the country thinks that SoCal is weird! Our one-person team (KY7M on SCCC#3) brought up 19th place, but hey, his score was still 12K. Why wasn't he at least on SCCC#2, you ask. . . . On Phone, SCCC#1 came in 3rd with 7 ops and SCCC#2 got lucky number 13. And let's not forget the #1 and #8 (CW) and #2 and #8 (Phone) showings of the SCCC in January's NAQP. THE VICE PREZ SEZ

The November Sweepstakes is one of the oldest (if not the oldest) major contest running today. My interest in SS and general curiosity prompted me to dig through my old QSTs to find out 1) When the SCCC was formed and 2) How well has the SCCC fared compared to other clubs in the ARRL club competition portion of the SS. Included in this issue are the results of the investigation. It is interesting to note that last year the SCCC turned in an aggregate score higher than any year since the first year the club was eligible for competition. And to think that I thought the SCCC's performance in SS was dwindling! Dave, KoLL, was responsible for about 20% of our club score with the two logs he submitted (CW and Phone combined). As a matter of fact, Dave has pretty much dominated the top SCCC standings for the last 3 years. The calls listed as Club High CW and SSB were as listed in the pages of QST. I did note however that several instances existed where other SCCC members actually did better than those listed as "Club Highs." Either those people were not SCCC members at that time or they failed to put "SCCC" in the Club Affiliation block on their summary sheets! (Or they didn't attend the required number of meetings...cd)

League Club Competition is broken down into the following categories: Small Clubs - up to mine logs submitted; Medium Clubs (our typical category) 10 to 49 logs submitted; and Unlimited Clubs - 50 or more logs submitted). Our best finish seems to have been 2nd out of 75 entries in the Local Category in 1981. It looks as though we came on strong in the early years and kinda pooped out in 1979-80. What happened? (I can tell you what happened, but it is a long story...ed) Oh well, I believe interest is on the rise again and this year will be a banner year for the SCCC. Who will take this year's club high for Phone and CW? Are we going to see K6LL's call in those

columns again or will it be yours?

Now, I must beat the drum one last time. This year the CW SS will fall 2 weeks after CQWW Phone, and Phone SS the week before CQWW CW. Check the SCCC Calendar on the back page for exact dates. If you're not planning a major effort in CQWW this year, take a crack at Sweepstakes. If you can swing them both, great! Whether you launch an all-out effort or casually operate, please remember to indicate "SCCC" on your summary sheets. If we can get half the members to turn in a score for CW and SSB, I believe the SCCC will have a good shot at winning the ARRL Club Competition Gavel. ARRL National Convention

The ARRL National Convention was held in Los Angeles this year at the LAX Marriott on August 21, 22, and 23. Of interest to me were 1) the Contester's Lunch with Billy Lunt, KR1R, set up by Kurt, NI6W, and publicised in his column in the last issue, 2) The Contest Forum, and 3) Kurt's talk on Yagi Stress.

The Lunch was nice, and I got in another request for the All-Time Field Day records to get straightened out (in case you don't know it, SCCC holds the record for the highest score EVER achieved in FD), and I made a strong statement about keeping fluff out of the NCJ.

The Contest Forum was no more than KRIR giving a talk on how the ARRL scores logs. Don't worry,

they're fair. They basically got the right idea.

Kurt's talk on stress was built on the search for the prefect 20 Meter Beam and was very well presented except that he offered more data than could be absorbed by anyone who had not sat beside him as he figured it out over the last few months. Nevertheless, Glenn and I learned a valuable lesson - based on Kurt's computer analyses, we have been doing it right all along. Good for us. -- Mark, WA60TU
