1982 will be remembered as a banner year for the Southern California Contest Club. We earned our first plaque in the CQWW DX Contest---MOST IMPROVED CLUB SCORE in the WORLD!!! It is something we can all be proud of---very proud. We finished fourth in the world (with a score of 68,224,180 points) behind the Yankee Clipper Contest Club (YCCC), the Frankford Radio Club, and the Northern California Contest Club (NCCC), and ahead of such respectable clubs as the Potomac Valley Radio Club (PVRC) and the North Texas Contest Club.

We were led by Dick Norton, N6AA who operated 9Y4VT, where he simply ran away with the contest honors. Dick set new world records for both phone (11,954,696 points) and CW (6,929,450 points). Meanwhile, Jim Neiger, N6TJ operated 8P6J to third place in the world on CW with 4,636,763 points and added 2,042,866 points on phone. Also, Jim Rafferty, N6RJ added 4,262,180 points on phone from ZF2FL. And, of course, the rest of you put together the other 20 million plus points. Isn't it amazing what we can do when we try?! Each one of you can certainly be proud to have taken part in the Southern California Contest Club's greatest triumph to date.

Coincidentally, the 1983 ARRL DX Contest results recently came out also. There was no organized effort of any kind by us in that contest so we finished a little farther down in it but never-the-less won the same plaque--MOST IMPROVED CLUB (points per entry)!

Jim at 8P6J was the big winner for us in this contest. He had the world's highest combined score (CW and PHONE).

And so, in the two greatest DX contest events, the Southern California Contest Club has put together two back to back outstanding efforts.

Well guys---I think we have proven we can be a respectable club. A little enthusiasm, a little work, and we are able to produce some good results. Let's keep up the good work (and remember, every little bit helps-get on during these contests even if you can't be on the whole time. Do what you can and send in that score! And don't forget to write down the club name on the summary sheet!)
