PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mercifully, it's all over but the shouting. Uh, counting. For some of us, the CO Worldwide was mostly a matter of survival. Seems like the problems were more prevalent this year - or maybe we're just getting too old to cope.

First, let's take a look at some of the problems and excuses:
